## From the Constitution of The Saint Andrew's Society of Vermont

## ARTICLE II - Membership

1. None but Scots, or lineal descendants of natives of Scotland, or members of the immediate family of same, of good moral character, shall be admitted to membership in the Society. The classes of membership shall be: Regular Member, Junior Member, Life Member, Hereditary Life Member and Honorary Life Member. A Family membership shall consist of both spouses and all children under the age of 18. One spouse may be of non-Scottish descent. Both spouses are Regular Members. Children under 18 are Junior Members and shall not vote or hold office. At 18 they must become Regular Members in order to remain on the roll of members.

Any Regular Member may become a Life Member by payment of a fee equal to twenty (20) times the current annual dues in one lump sum; or any Regular Member of at least fifteen (15) years in good standing may become a Life Member by the payment of a fee equal to fifteen (15) times the current annual dues in one lump sum; or any Regular Member on attaining the age of seventy-five years and with twenty (20) years of continuous membership in the Society may upon a favorable vote of the Board of Managers become a Life Member; there shall be no fees associated with becoming a Life Member by reason of age.

Minors (less than eighteen (18) years of age) children and grand children of living or deceased members may be admitted to Hereditary Life Membership upon submission of an application signed by a proposer and a second, both of whom are members in good standing of the Society, together with the current application fee and a payment of a fee equal to ten (10) times the current annual dues in one lump sum for each membership. Such members shall not take part in the Society's deliberations, vote or hold office until they have reached the age of eighteen (18) years.
